

Oak Hollow Landtrust Final Report 2017-2018

ELA: (English Language Arts)

Every grade was successful in demonstrating growth for the 2017-2018 in Language Arts. Fourth grade demonstrated the most growth with a 33% increase in proficiency on the Reading Inventory from fall to spring. While grades one, two and three demonstrated growth in language arts, they did not meet their growth goal. As a grade level, first, second and third grade met the district benchmark by winter 2018. Below is a chart with the growth demonstrated at each grade and an indication if the grade level met their goal.

Kindergarten: (Correct letter sounds) Goal met- 97% of all kindergarten students demonstrated an increase of 28 letter sounds from fall to spring.

Grade Four: (Reading Inventory) Growth goal met

Average growth by grade level: 143 points (Goal was 115 points)

Fifth grade: (Reading Inventory) Growth goal met.

Average growth by grade level: 128 points (Goal was 115 points)

Average Lexile by grade: 871

Math:

While all grades demonstrated growth and met the district end of year benchmark, not all grades met their growth goal for 2017-2018 in math. Fourth grade demonstrated the most growth with 33% increase in proficiency on the DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy) computation. On average, students in grades one through five met the end of year district benchmark for computation in the winter of 2018. Kindergarten students met the end of year district benchmark for next number fluency in Spring of 2018. Though every grade demonstrated growth, we may have set too ambitious goals, since only one grade made the goal and one came within one percent of meeting the goal. Below is a chart for each grade indicating the growth made and the goal that was set.
